ORCA Winter Programs

SAIL's ORCA (Outdoor Recreation & Community Access) Program is seeking an active and self-motivated student interested in outdoor studies, outdoor leadership, health or social services. Interns will receive professional training with hands-on experience in the adaptive recreation field.

Program Description The ORCA program provides year-round outdoor recreation opportunities to individuals of all ages who experience a disability. Weekdays are filled with after school outings for youth and courses ranging from rock climbing to Nordic skiing for all ages. From January through mid-April, ORCA conducts alpine and Nordic ski and snowboard lessons on weekend days at Eaglecrest Ski Area and the Mendenhall Campground. ORCA hosts an annual ski trip to Juneau for individuals from outlying communities and optional ski trips to Haines. Interns will receive hands on training in preparation, planning and leading activities and classes. Interns will also provide on-snow instruction in skiing and/or snowboarding, with the opportunity to earn instruction certification through the Professional Ski Instructors of America (PSIA).

Required Skills and Experience The intern will possess:

- The ability to ski and/or snowboard on groomed green and blue runs, or an intermediate level cross country skiing ability.
- Experience with other outdoor pursuits and basic outdoor skills.
- An ability to lift 50 pounds.
- An interest in working with diverse populations.
- An ability to thrive in a rapidly changing and dynamic environment.
- Flexibility for activity plans based on weather, location, time, etc.

Time Commitment and Duration

- A minimum 8hrs/wk through December; 12hrs/wk January to mid-April.
- Ski/snowboard instruction on weekends, January through mid-April (~5-12 hours total).
- One to three weekday outings per week (~4-12 hours total).
- Intern will be an integral part of activity preparation and clean-up.
- Additional hours can be assigned/worked based on intern's interest, schedule and flexibility.

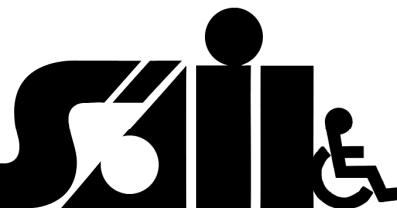
Compensation and Benefits
